



Question: Why is the Joliet Cursillo in need of money?

- The cost of a Cursillo weekend is on the rise, which is consistent with the rising cost of material goods and services in the current economy.
- The amount charged each candidate for a weekend does not cover the real cost of a weekend.
- For the past few years weekends and miscellaneous items needed for weekends have been subsidized through an endowment and various donations.
- For many years team leaders have also covered extra costs.
- Raising the cost per candidate to cover the real cost would result in fewer candidates and team volunteers.
- Weekends may become unaffordable for many candidates to attend.
