THREE TEMPTATIONS OF LEADERSHIP
We are encouraged during our three day Cursillo weekend to be Leaders. As we learned then, everyone influences his/her environment and that is what a leader does. But there are some dangers to our relationships in leadership when it is conducted for the wrong reasons.

#1. Ambition. Leaders show initiative and that is a good thing. Ambition becomes a negative thing when it overpowers humility and steps on the plan that God has given us. The "medicine" for the malady of ambition is humility. We do all things for God with and because of the grace He gives us. We SERVE.

#2. Need to prove oneself to others. Leaders serve others in Cursillo and in their environments of home, work, and parish. Because they are serving, they have nothing to prove to anyone. They just do what God leads them and empowers them to do.

#3. "If I were in charge..." Leaders don't create the agenda. They work to make the agenda succeed. What is the agenda? It is to lead others not just to a three day "retreat," but to a deeper relationship with Christ.

Christ has called us to be leaders in our daily lives. With His grace and His Holy Spirit, let's do the job he gave us!

SCHOOL OF LEADERS

Fundamental to our living by faith is our personal acceptance of God reaching out to us with two hands through the gift of the Holy Spirit and the gift of the incarnate Son of God. The outreach of the life-giving Spirit was symbolized already in the opening verses of the Bible by the Spirit of God hovering over the waters of our planet (Gn 1:2) to draw forth the good earth and its lush vegetation. This overshadowing of the Spirit is called God's grace, termed sanctifying grace through its power to unite us with God's immortal life and habitual grace through its power to dispose the yearnings and love of our hearts in accordance with God choosing to adopt us as his children. As Jesus said, it is given as a fountain welling up within us (Jn 7:38). In Cursillo we recognize that to be authentic Christians we need a commitment not only to live by these two encounters with God but also to share our life of faith with others we meet, beginning with some who are fellow cursillistas. This is why Cursillo stresses not only the life of grace and ongoing friendship with Jesus Christ, but also ongoing friendship with others based on mutual sharing of our spiritual lives through grouping. We have taken to heart the promise of Jesus that through the personal union of Christians the world will come to know Christ and the love of his divine Father (Jn 17:21).

At the heart of the Cursillo Movement is personal contact with others. While this Newsletter may provide information, Cursillo is about the personal interaction among the friends of Christ. Engage your friends in the joy of living the life of grace. De Colores

I would really enjoy saying next month that we have those positions filled for both the men's and women's weekends. The men's weekend is September 10-13 and the women's weekend is October 8-11. None of the positions are difficult and I'm sure there are many people willing to help but I just need someone to step forward to become the leader.

Speaking of time flashing by, as Cursillo Chair I have the honor of presenting a list of candidates to the Secretariat for nomination to be rector for the next men's and women's Cursillos. Our guidelines to be a rector are that one must have been on at least four teams and given three rollos. Those guidelines are to present a rector with first-hand knowledge of the weekend as to the flow of the talks and timing of all the things that go on during each day of the weekend. They also learn the role of the team meetings that lead up to the weekend. There are books avail-

able that explain the weekend and we give each rector some information but the knowledge one receives from personal experience is "priceless." Once the list is given to the Secretariat, they pray and discern as to who they will nominate via a voting procedure. Once an order has been chosen, I will begin calling those individuals to pray about accepting the role of rector. Please pray for the Secretariat and for the names of the people on that list so that Christ will continue to lead our Diocese with capable people who are willing to be His Disciples.

One last thing I would like to talk about is the possibility of having a spring weekend. There has been discussion about people wanting to live a spring weekend as the fall just doesn't work for them. I would like to get a few people together to discuss this and see if a spring weekend is something we can do. If I don't get any feedback on this I will take it that nobody wants to move forward with exploring a spring weekend.

COMFORT ZONE

We all look for, seek and settle in to a comfort zone. There is nothing wrong with being in our comfort zone as long as we don't stay in our comfort zone. Jesus told His disciples and us that we are invited to be with Him in His kingdom. We have to accept that invitation, leave our comfort zone and go on the journey, the pilgrimage that the Guia, the Pilgrim's Guide, helps us with.

On our pilgrimage we will come across many people and circumstances (the environment that is referred to on the Cursillo weekend). One of our tasks as baptized Christians is to aid and assist others to join our pilgrimage to the Kingdom of God. Pope Francis has afforded all of us an opportunity to step out of our comfort zone. His recent encyclical, *Laudato Si'*, deals with the global environment and has engendered interest, comment, dispute, and discussion among many aspects of our society that are not Catholic, not Christian, and even those who are agnostic or atheistic.

What is the opportunity the Pope has given us? There are two things we can do that are out of the comfort zones for most of us. We can study. We can read what the Pope has said in his encyclical. We can do more than reading and hearing

what others say is in it. We can study how the lessons in the encyclical can be applied to our own lives. We can take action. We can be prepared when friends or acquaintances or fellow workers mention the environment. At that time we can introduce God into the conversation or discussion and be God's instrument to pique an interest in God's plan for all of us or encourage a more selfless consideration of how we treat God's gift of creation to us.

Most of us are not comfortable with studying an encyclical or introducing God into everyday conversations. Just maybe, that is exactly the cross He wants you to bear. Think about it. Pray about it. Decide. Act.
